

BSNL, C-DoT to build CMS to track all forms of communication-Report

The project will cost 450-crore and will be funded by the government

State owned Bharat Sanchar Nigam (BSNL) and telecom research arm of the government.

Centre for Development of Telematics (C-DoT) will collaborate to a build virtual private network that will use a technology known as multiprotocol label switching (MPLS) which will enable the centralised monitoring system (CMS) to track all, be it over mobile, landline, satellite, internet networks to even voice over internet protocol (VoIP) calls, according to an internal telecom department note.

The project will cost 450-crore and will be funded by the government. it is expected to be completed within a year.

The network will provide a bulwark to India's much-awaited automated surveillance network, popularly known as the Centralised Monitoring System, according to an ET report.

The note said that state-run Bharat Sanchar Nigam (BSNL) will initially provide MPLS connectivity across 81 locations on the CMS network in eight licenced service areas, including Delhi, Mumbai, Kolkata, Chennai, Haryana, Rajasthan, Punjab and Karnataka," the note says.
